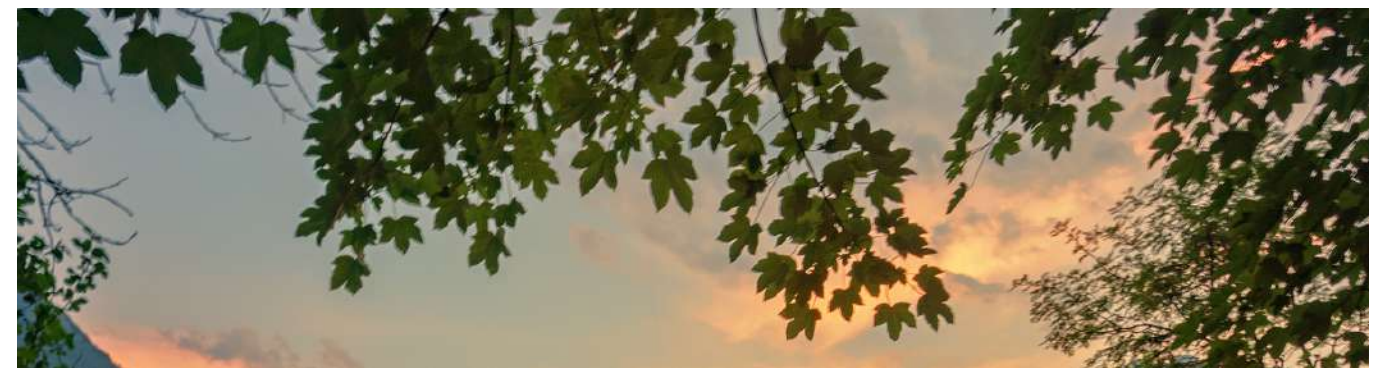




Bhutan

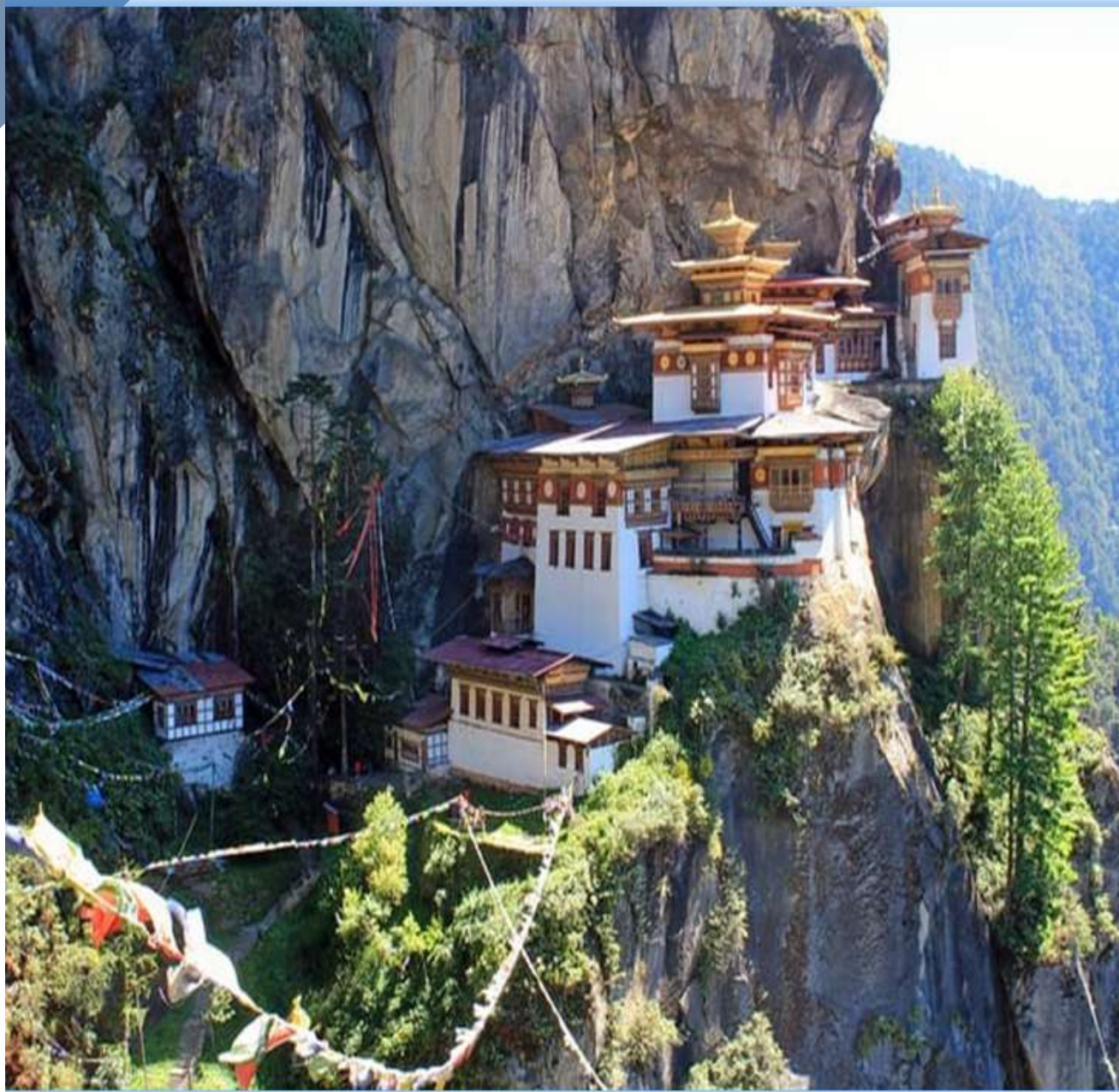




Explore Bhutan

- Bhutan, the smallest Himalayan country, is home to a wealth of historical, spiritual, and adventurous attractions.



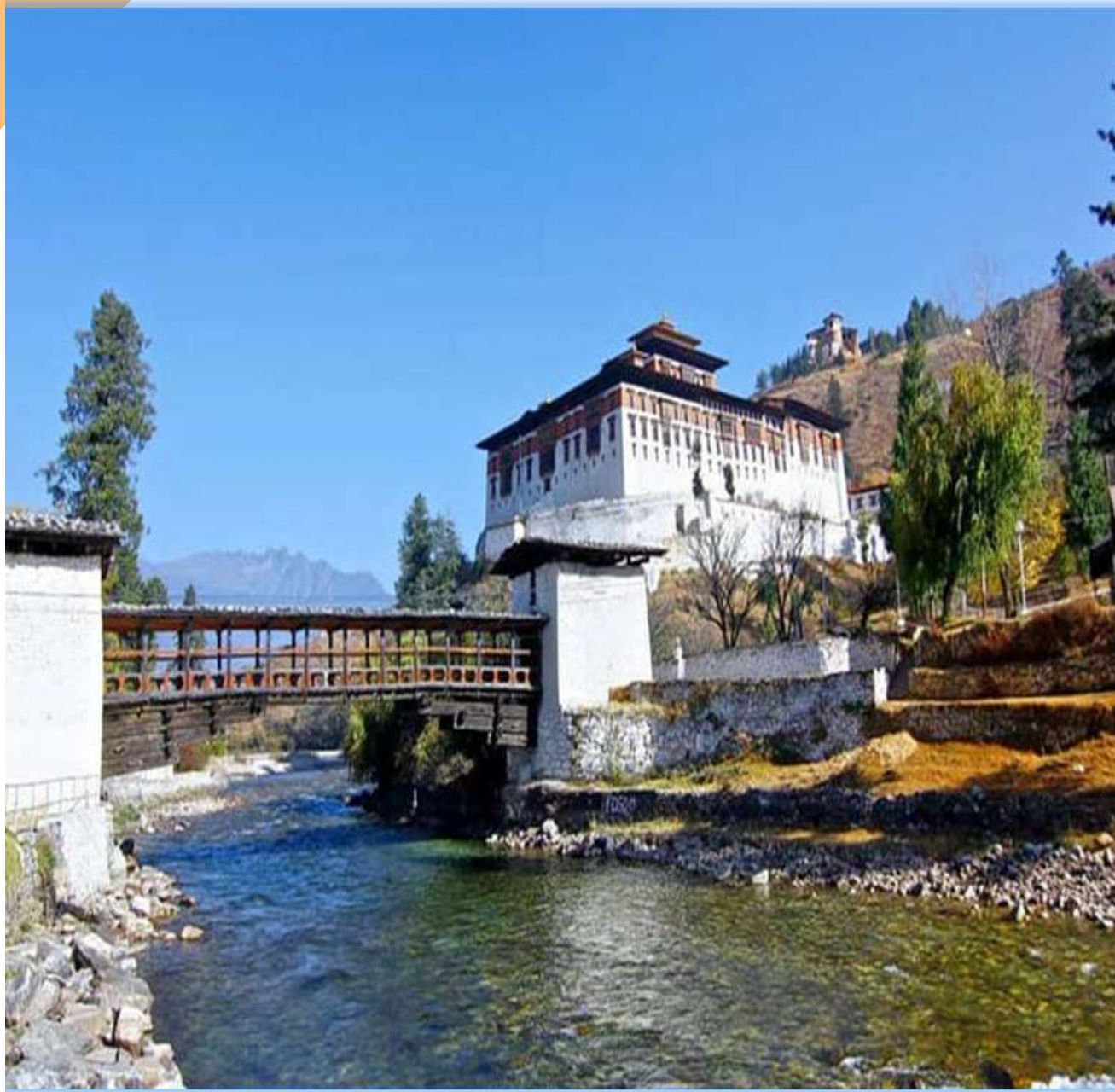


Taktsang Palphug Monastery

This monastery is unusually situated on top of a mountain 1200 metres above the Paro Valley, and it is surrounded by breathtaking natural beauty. One of the nicest sites to see in Bhutan is this white building with a golden roof against a backdrop of a clear blue sky and beautiful green hills.

10 km away from Paro city

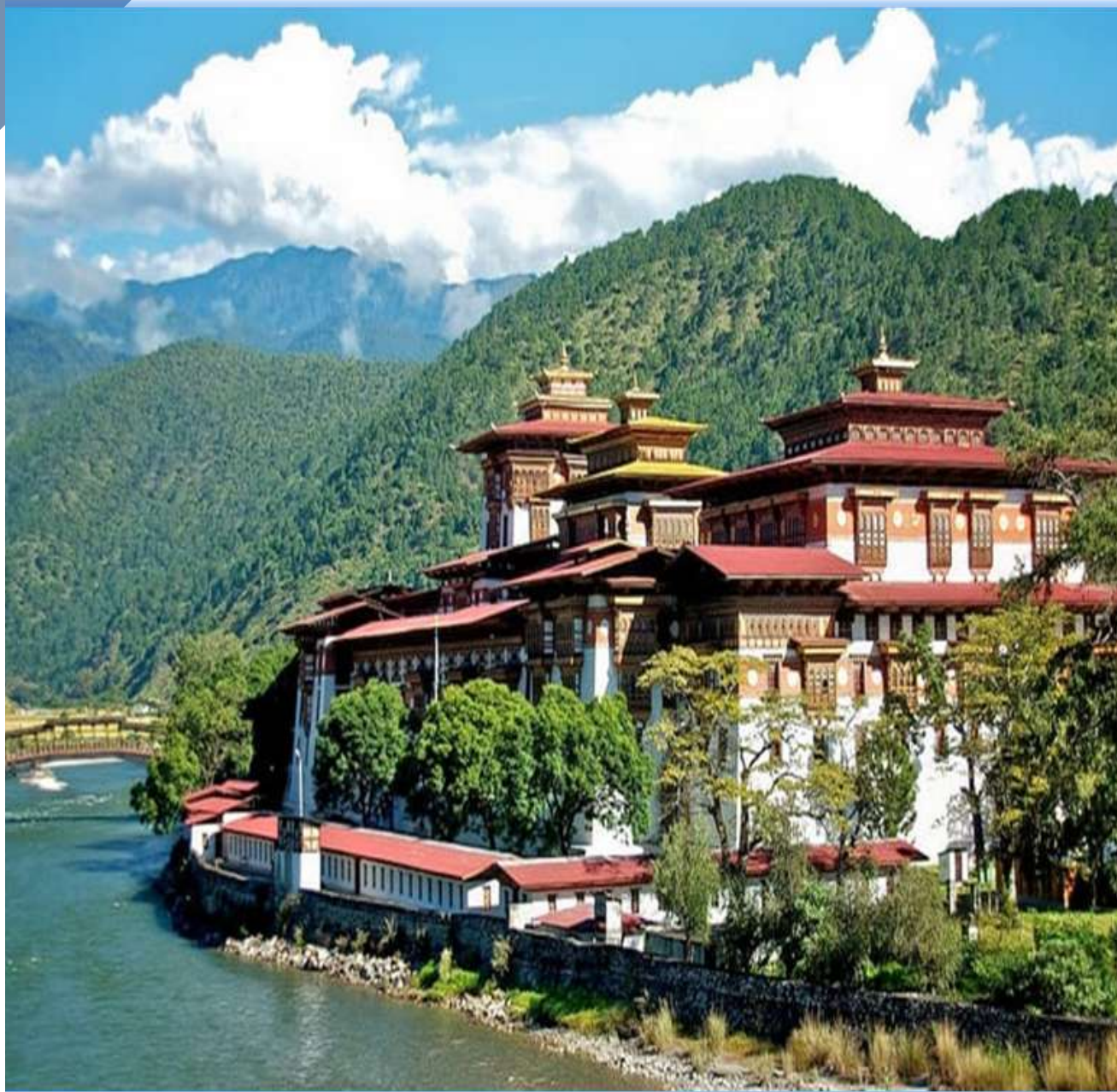


Rinpung Dzong

Rinpung Dzong, a magnificent piece of architecture with astounding spiritual vibrations, is situated in Paro. It is well recognised to contain a large number of images that beautifully depict Buddha's life. Attending the spectacular annual celebration known as Paro Tshechu is something visitors to this place can look forward to doing. One of the best things to do in Bhutan is to visit Rinpung Dzong, which offers a restorative vacation.

Paro District, Bhutan

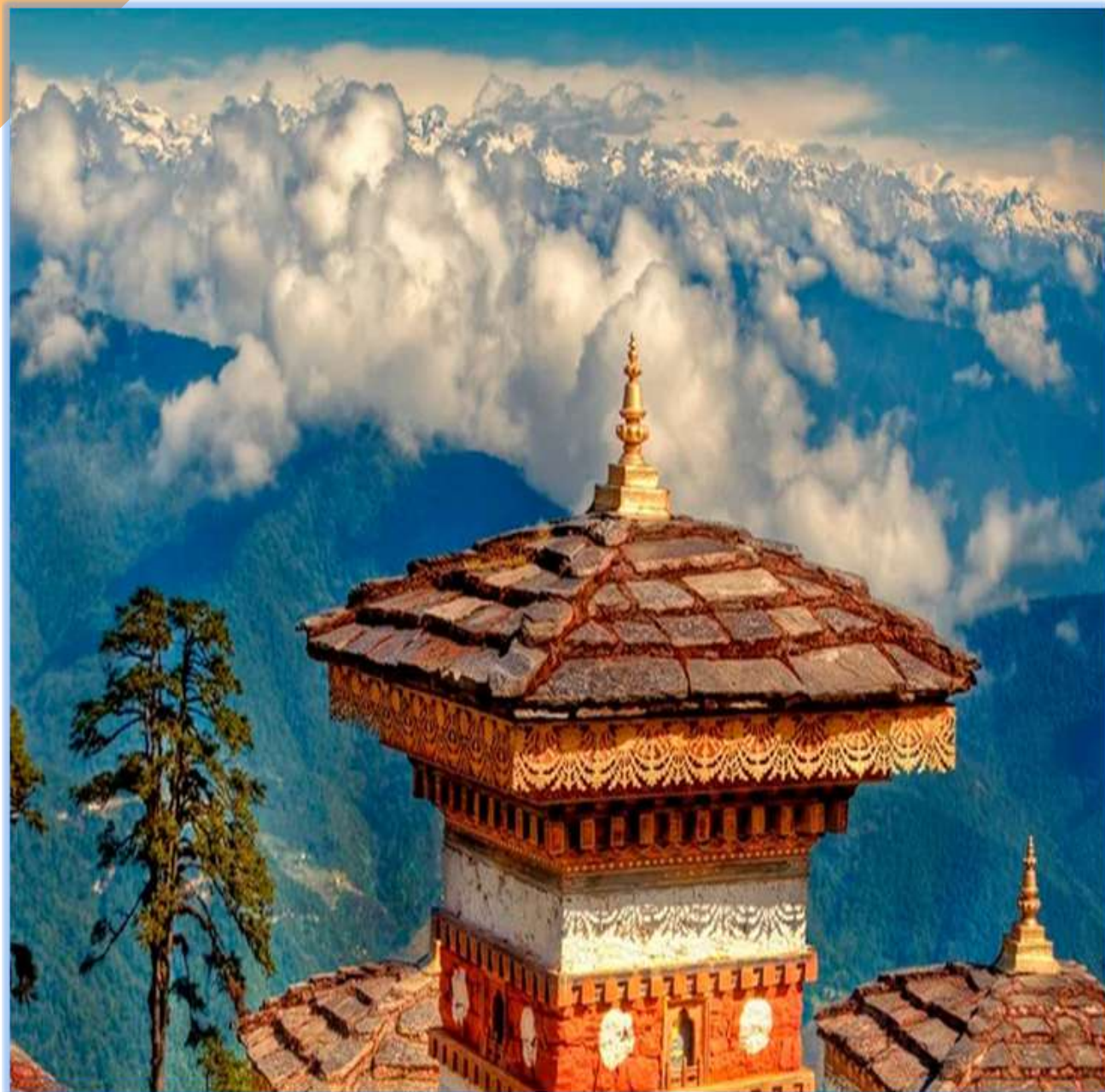


Punakha Dzong

One of the nicest sites to visit in Bhutan is the Dzong, which is surrounded by breathtaking natural beauty with lush green hills and a bright blue sky as a backdrop. Bhutan's Dzong is very significant historically and culturally. It served as the administrative centre for a while. The holy artefact Ranjung Karsapani and Zhabdrung Ngawang Namgyal's bones are also preserved there.

LOCATION

Located at the confluence of beautiful rivers of Pho Chhu and Mo Chhu in Punakha & Khuruthang , Bhutan.



Dochula Pass

While travelling from Punakha to Thimphu, a magnificent area called Dochula Pass is located more than ten thousand feet above sea level.

One of the best sites to visit in Bhutan, the location provides a panoramic view of the surrounding snow-covered mountains as well as a stunning vista of the 108 Chortens and colourful flags flapping in the wind.

LOCATION

Elevation of 10,171 ft on east-west Road from Thimpu to Punakha.



Buddha Dordenma

This Buddha statue, which is perched majestically atop a large meditation hall, radiates calm and tranquilly and is regarded as one of the best sites to visit in Bhutan. According to legend, the endeavour was foretold as far back as the eighth century in a sacred artefact that Guru Padmasambhava safeguarded. It serves as a symbol of the manifestation of human religion and of universal peace and pleasure.

LOCATION

Kuenselphodrang Nature Park, marking the southern entrance to the valley of Thimphu.



Dirang

It is constructed in the manner of Tibetan architecture, and its enormous hall contains some exquisite woodwork. Pema Tinley constructed the Gangteng Monastery in 1613, making it one of Bhutan's most significant historical tourism destinations. In November, it is also renowned for hosting the Black-Necked Crane Festival.

LOCATION

Gangtey Monastery, Wangdue Phodrang District, Bhutan



National Museum of Zorig Chusum

The National Institute for Zorig Chusum offers four to six years of study in each of its 13 Bhutanese traditional arts course disciplines. The classes attract students who are primarily interested in painting, needlework, sculpture, clay modelling, wood carving, etc.

LOCATION

Pedzoe Lam, Thimphu, Bhutan

A unique cultural history that has been passed down through the generations has led to a combination of social manners, culture, and religion. Tourists can participate in the Bhutanese people's passion of their festivals.

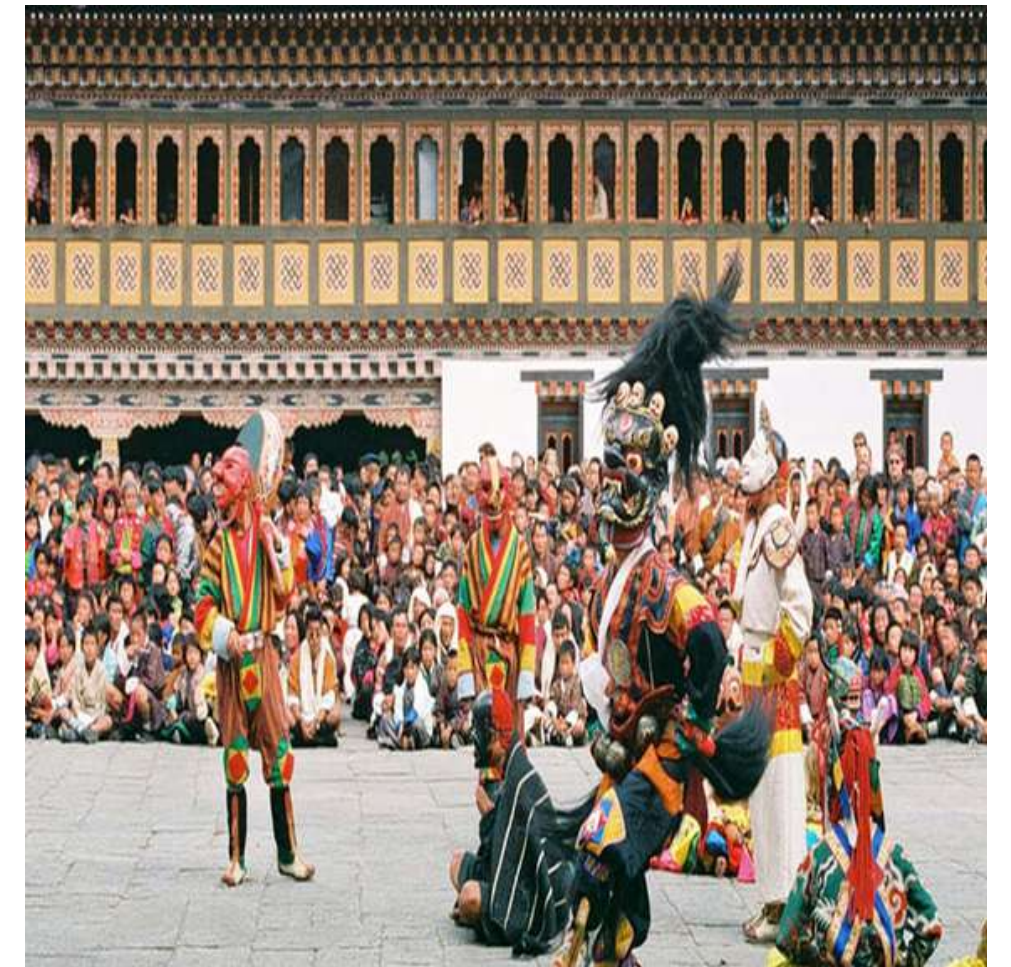

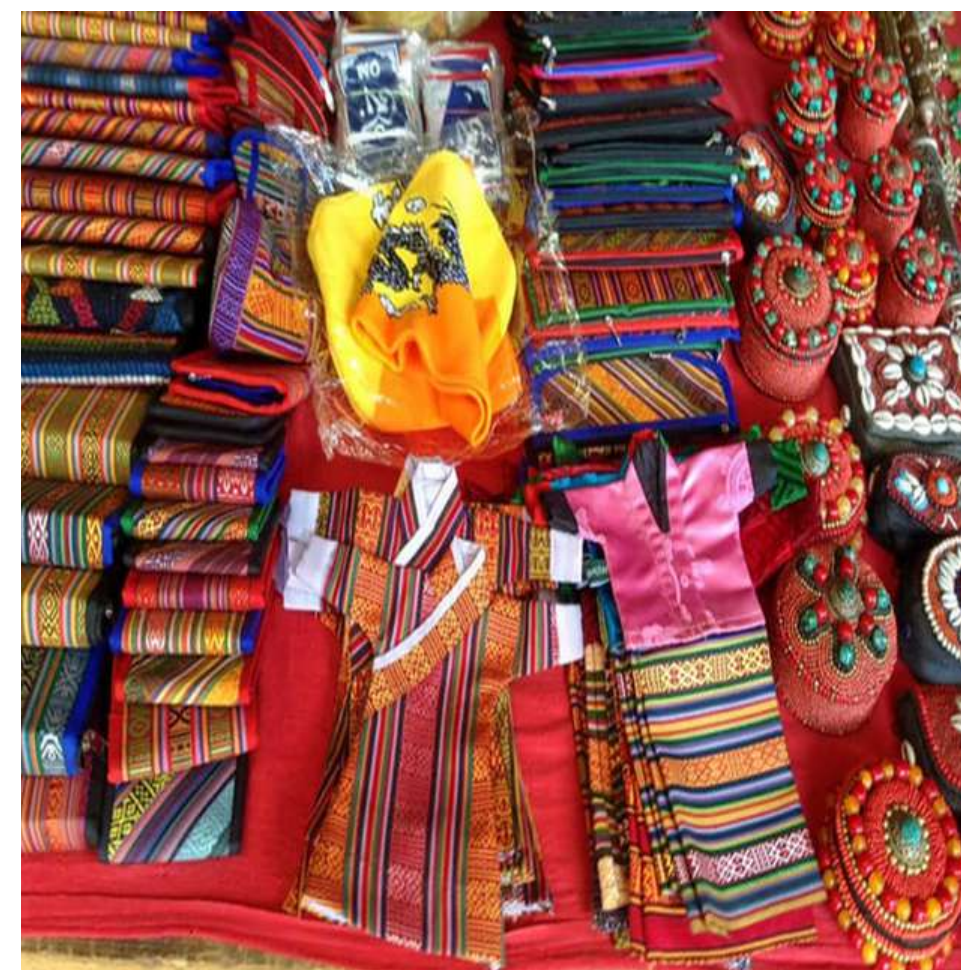
The cuisine of Arunachal Pradesh is a popular topic since it is an integral component of North East Indian culture and satisfies ones food cravings.

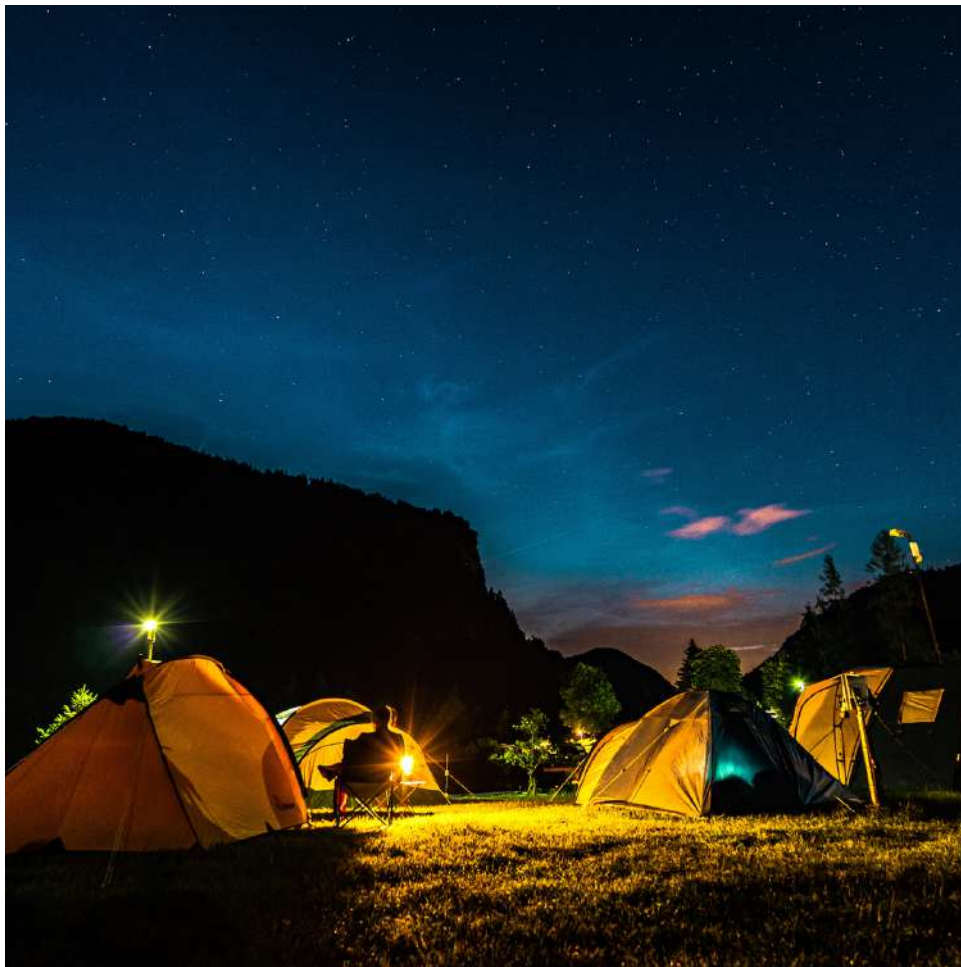

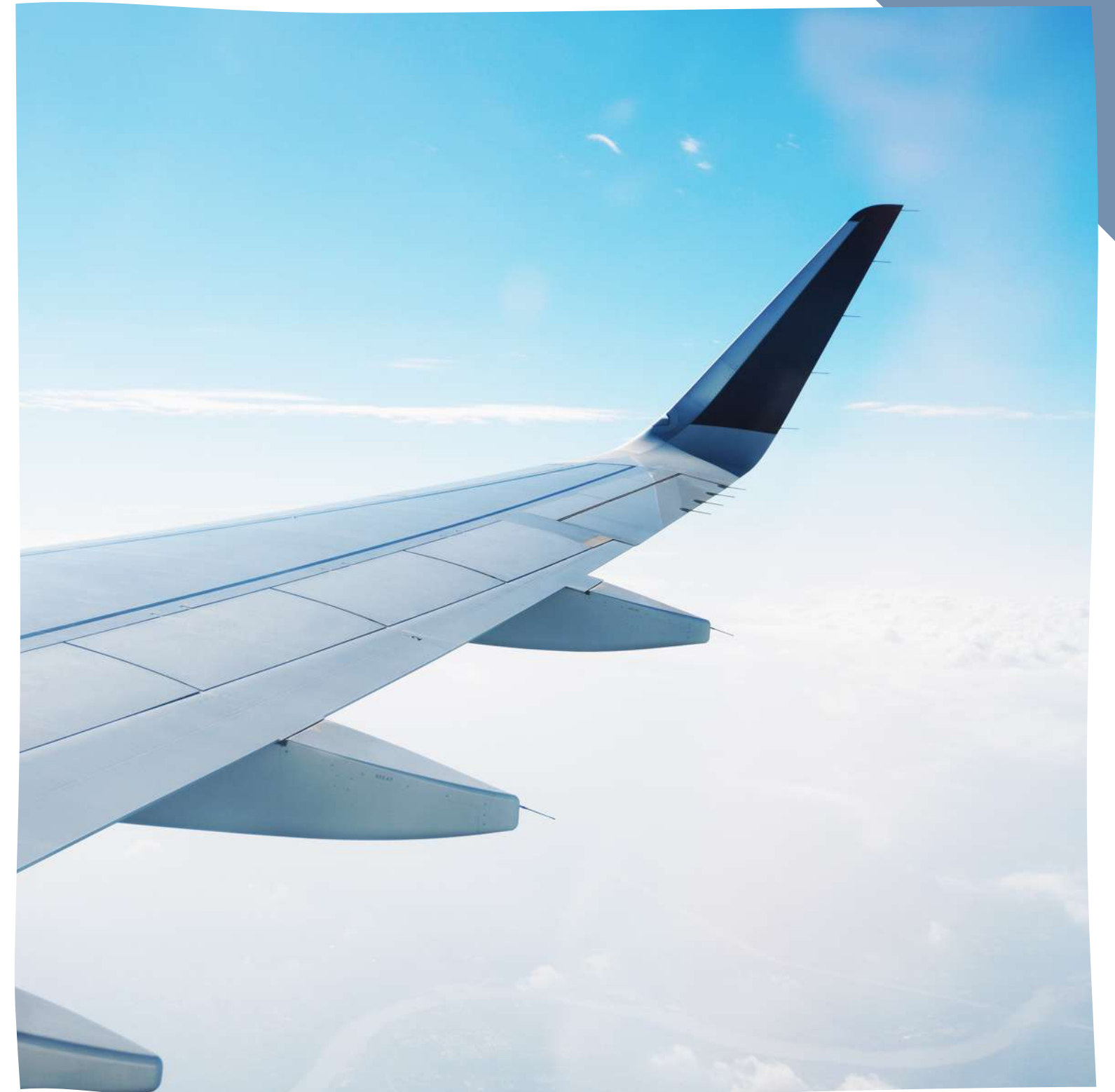
